PURPOSE:

To ensure the rights of patient visitation.

POLICY:

Madison County Memorial Hospital complies with Florida's No Patient Left Alone Act by posting its patient visitation policy on the hospital's website at mcmh.us and may request visitors to agree in writing to follow the hospital's visitation policies and procedures.

In-Person Visitation

In-person visitation is allowed in all the following circumstances, unless the patient objects:

- At the request of the patient.
- End-of-life situations.
- Patient who was living with family before admission and is struggling with the change in environment and lack of in-person family support.
- Patient making one or more major medical decisions.
- Patient experiencing emotional distress or grieving a recent death.
- Patient needs cueing or encouragement to eat or drink which was previously provided by a family member or caregiver.
- Patient who used to talk and interact with others is now seldom speaking.
- Childbirth, including labor and delivery.
- Pediatric patients.

Essential Caregiver

• A patient may designate an **essential caregiver** (family member, friend, guardian, or other individual).

- The essential caregiver is permitted at least **2 hours** of in-person visitation **daily** in addition to any other visitation authorized by the Hospital.
- The caregiver is not required to provide medical or custodial care; they are simply afforded access under this policy.
- The Hospital shall allow consensual physical contact between the patient and their essential caregiver.

PROCEDURES:

Hospital Requirements for Visitors:

- Provide education and training on communicable diseases, including proper personal protective equipment, mask use when indicated, and hand hygiene.
- Make surgical masks available at the entrances.
- Post communicable-disease symptoms at each entrance to encourage visitors to postpone their visit if symptomatic.

Visitors Requirements:

- Self-screening for communicable-disease symptoms by reviewing posted symptom lists at entrances.
- Reconsider visiting if experiencing any communicable-disease symptoms.
- Mask use is optional; if a visitor chooses to wear one, any clean face covering is acceptable. When visiting a patient with an infectious disease, complete education and training on the appropriate use of personal protective equipment, mask use, and hand hygiene.
- Wear hospital-provided PPE as appropriate per hospital policy and CDC guidelines.
- Remain in the patient's room or in designated visitation areas only.
- No proof of vaccination or immunization will be required for entry.

Visitation Hours & Limits

- **Medical/Surgical Floors**: 7:00 AM–7:00 PM daily.
- End-of-Life Patients: 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Special Units (e.g., ER, infectious disease patients): Two visitors allowed concurrently.
- Outpatient/Scheduled Procedures: One visitor per patient.

The charge nurse is responsible for ensuring staff follow the visitation policy and any unit-specific visitor limits.

The Hospital may suspend or revoke in-person visitation privileges of a specific visitor **only** if that visitor violates the hospital's written visitation policies and procedures (for example, bypassing symptom screening, refusing required PPE, or failing to comply with infection-control protocols).

Should a patient or family member encounter resistance in exercising their visitation rights under this policy, they may file a complaint with AHCA online at: www.ahca.myflorida.com/visitation.

This policy shall be submitted to the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) upon licensure renewal, as required by law.
